US MISSILE ATTACK ON SYRIA: THE ACT AND ITS AFTERMATH

Executive Summary

- 1. In early April 2017, US President Donald Trump ordered a missile attack on a Syrian air base in response to reports that the Assad regime had used poison gas as a weapon against local men, women and children.
- 2. The raid was very successful. It destroyed a number of aircraft and other facilities on the base.
- 3. There were profound domestic and foreign responses to President Trump's decision. Most were positive.
- 4. President Trump's popularity rose as most Americans approved of the action.

 Trump was seen as decisive and presidential. The move helped Trump politically.
- 5. Most foreign countries approved of the attack. Many lauded Trump's decision.

 The action enhanced President Trump's foreign policymaking reputation.
- 6. Russia, Iran and North Korea did not approve of the action and after the attack criticised and even threatened the United States.
- 7. China's President Xi Jinping was attending a meeting with President Trump at the time. The meeting went on. US-China relations subsequently improved.
- 8. Questions arose after the event concerning the Trump administration's strategy vis-à-vis Syria, particularly whether the United States sought regime change there, how this would affect US relations with Russia, Iran and North Korea, and generally what would come next.
- 9. North Korea was the biggest problem that emerged after the missile attack.
